From 2016 to May of 2019, Quechua Benefit staff and volunteers have tested and treated more than 16,639 children in 38 communities for anemia.


With your help, Quechua Benefit conducts its anemia prevention program with the cooperation of the Ministries of Health and Education in the Colca Valley.

Our anemia campaign includes educational materials and training presented by a professional nutritionist. Your generosity is also providing multivitamins with iron to achieve long-lasting results since it takes time for anemic children to recover.

Every dollar you invest in anemia prevention is multiplied!

Most nonprofits have overhead of 20% or more. Quechua Benefit's Board of Directors pays its overhead, so every dollar you donate multiplies.

\$1.00 becomes \$1.20. Because our partners contribute 57% of costs in our fight against anemia, the \$1.20 becomes \$2.79.



In one of our service areas, the Caylloma District, the average anemia level has been reduced from 47% to 25% in two years.

Since 2017 Quechua Benefit has collected 160,000 data points on more than 15,000 people using Debra's database.







What do I mean by a "delivery system"?
Getting tools to people who need them in ways that encourage people to use them—that is a delivery system. It is crucial, and it is often complex. It can require getting around barriers of poverty, distance, ignorance, doubt, stigma, and religious and gender bias. It means listening to people, learning what

they want, what they're doing, what they believe, and what barriers they face. It means paying attention to how people live their lives. That's what you need to do if you have a lifesaving tool or technique you want to deliver to people.
