

Casa Chapi's teachers have been trained to provide virtual learning for your kids. Please pray for the government to open the rural highlands schools in March.

When Alejandro Tejeda, our Peru Country Director, received permission to travel to the highlands, he made deliveries and reported,

"I saw our kids after two and a half months. Those days were very emotional for the kids and me. They miss attending Casa Chapi and seeing their teachers."

In 2020 you have reached more than 17,000 people in remote villages with masks, soap and educational brochures. Because of you Quechua Benefit is fighting the spread of COVID. The women and children feel your love. They know you have not

Your generosity plus the matching donation of one of our board members helped us surpass our year-end goal from September to December of \$150,000! Your gifts are at work today distributing life-saving supplies and employing Quechua women who are sewing masks.

In Phase 1 of the mask project, we delivered nearly **7000 masks to 9 towns**. During Phase 2, we delivered **10,000 masks to 14 towns**.

The masks, soap, and brochures the people have received provide the physical support they need to stay healthy. **Just as important is the love these people feel coming from you.** They are so grateful that someone has remembered them and cares for them.

We hit it off and had several Zoom meetings with the congregation and missions committee. St. Paul's initial project was to sponsor Ichumpampa's COVID campaign, and they raised funds to supply masks and soap for the entire town.

We are currently working with St. Paul's on a food program for the elderly and the possibility of a women's and children's clinic upstairs in the Sister Antonia Kitchen in Ichupampa that you helped rebuild.

Pastor Marty made the following comments about St. Paul's commitment:
