

Finally, Peru's COVID death rate is declining! Approximately 14,900,000 (49.6%) of Peru's population of 29,000,000 have been fully vaccinated.

However, vaccinations have been slow to reach the high-lands where your Casa Chapi families live. Alejandro reports that COVID cases in the Colca Valley are down, and most activities are operating at a normal level. However, schools remain closed.

Because of your support, your Casa Chapi grade school kids are still learning at home.

You're providing monthly food boxes, schoolbooks, cellphones, and internet access so they can connect with their teachers.
